OUR SPEAKER:

Dr. John Howard is a professor of both Paediatrics and Medicine in the Schulich Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry at the University of Western Ontario. He is the chief of the Paediatric Gastroenterology and Nutrition Division of the Children's Hospital of Western Ontario. His previous roles include Assistant Dean of Undergraduate Education and Assistant Dean of Alumni Affairs. He is a highly recognised teacher, having received over 25 teaching awards - including a UWO Pleva Award recognizing outstanding UWO teachers, and a OCUFA Award recognising outstanding Ontario professors.



Dr. Howard's academic interests include medical leadership, medical education and the doctor-patient relationship. He has played a major role in creating the Ecosystem Health initiative in the Faculty. As part of his desire to create child friendly information, he has a website called kidstummies.com which provides children with information about common paediatric GI diseases.

Dr. Howard provides mainly paediatric care in diseases of the gastrointestinal tract. He shares in the gastroenterological care of adult patients and is the lead physician of the home parenteral nutrition team. He has been recognized by the Department of Family Medicine as the "Consultant of the Year" - recognizing compassion, communication and clinical abilities.

He is married with three children.
